

What happens if I report an incident to the University?

Report made

Harassment, misconduct, or violence is reported to a university employee, or directly to Title IX

Web: up.edu/titleix

Report sent to the Title IX Coordinator

Disclosures made to non-confidential university employees must be shared with the Title IX Coordinator

Meet to discuss options and resources

Complainant is invited to meet with Title IX Coordinator to learn about resources, support, and resolution options

Complainant chooses how to proceed *

Complainant may choose to receive support services, and/or may choose to file a formal complaint

File a complaint, if complainant chooses *

Informal resolution –

Both parties voluntarily and mutually agree upon terms; this option is **not** appealable.

Formal resolution –

This option involves an investigation and live hearing; the outcome is appealable.

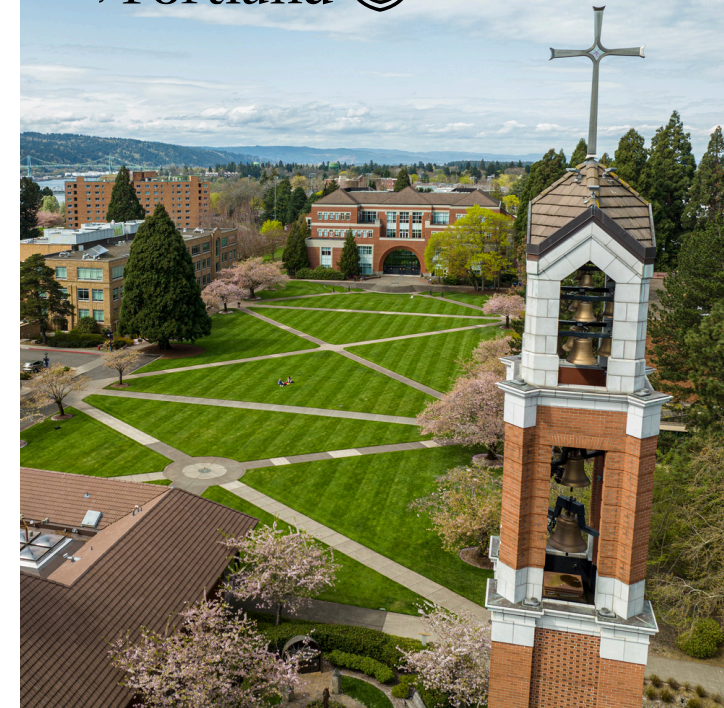
* A formal complaint is required in some situations

While the complainant's wishes will be taken into account as much as possible, the Title IX Coordinator may sign a formal complaint for allegations of violence, threats, use of weapons, and serial predation, or similar factors.

Examples of supportive measures:

- Housing accommodations
- Academic accommodations
- Referrals to counseling and/or medical services
- No contact orders
